Will small groups replace other groups?

In a word - no. Because small groups have a different purpose than other groups (care groups, serving groups, etc.), they are not a replacement for those groups but are intended to enhance all groups by building relationships.

5 Guidelines for Leading an Effective Small Group



1. Environment Matters


- Lecture hall vs the couch of a friend
- Greeting
- Pets (general rule: put them up)
- Childcare



2a. Rhythms

- Different from "big church"
- Room for creativity

2b. Select Curriculum

- Follow-up discussion from sermon
- Online resources
- WestArk library resources (Specific resources coming up!)



3. Ask good questions & listen

- Open-ended
- Active listening
- What themes do you hear in responses?
- Listen, think, speak



4. Lead

- Share the responsiblities • time keeper
 - prayer request
 notetaker
 - food coordinator
- Train your replacement



5. Communicate

- Decide on means of communication (email, text, GroupMe, etc.)
- Use them! =]






